The last two weeks I discussed the topic of guardian angels. I want to complete that discussion this week with a look at what the Congregation of Faith has identified as dangers to watch out for in venerating angels

8) Are there dangers to watch out for in venerating angels?

The Congregation stated:

Popular devotion to the Holy Angels, which is legitimate and good, can, however, also give rise to possible deviations:

- when, as sometimes can happen, the faithful are taken by the idea that the world is subject to a heavenly being, subordinate to the God, that is considered to be the controller of the material world and antagonistic to all that is purely spiritual.
- such struggles, or an incessant battle between good and evil spirits, or Angels and daemons, in which man is left at the mercy of superior forces and over which he is helpless; such concepts bear little relation to the true Gospel vision of the struggle to overcome the Devil, which requires moral commitment, a fundamental option for the Gospel, humility and prayer;
- when the daily events of life, which have nothing or little to do with our progressive maturing on the journey towards Christ are read schematically or simplistically, indeed childishly, so as to ascribe all setbacks to the Devil and all success to the Guardian Angels [op. cit., 217].

MASKS AT MASS: We requested of the Bishop and was granted a variance concerning the wearing of masks at mass. At St. Patrick's, masks are an option during mass. It is important that we still maintain 6' feet of social distancing, wear masks while entering the church, during communion, and while leaving the church. Masks will continue to be required at Mary Queen of Heaven in Chugwater, and daily masses. This is to accommodate those who are at high risk and attend daily mass to reduce their risk. In addition, beginning next Sunday we will have a mask required mass on Sunday evenings at 4:00 P.M. to accommodate those who wish to attend Sunday mass with masks. This will continue through the weekend before Thanksgiving. At that time we will assess the need for this additional mass.
